The Lucia Legend

In Sweden, the real beginning of Christmas observance is December 13th, the day set aside in honor of Lucia, the Queen of Light. By that day in thrifty households, the year's threshing, spinning, and weaving are finished, and Christmas preparation is completed. Lucia symbolizes the light which will return after weeks of long winter darkness and brings tidings of Christmas joy to come.

Fable has it that in the early days of Christianity, a lovely golden-haired girl named Lucia, who lived in Sicily, was betrothed at the age of 17. She was a devout Christian at a time when the people attempted to stamp out Christianity. Just before the wedding day, Lucia's mother became desperately ill. Lucia went to her church and promised God that she would donate her entire dowry if her mother were to become well again.

Her mother's health was restored, and Lucia's dowry was given to the poor. Her fiance's resentment was so great that in revenge, he turned her over to the soldiers who were persecuting the Christians. Without trial, young, lovely Lucia was burned at the stake.

Not long afterward, stories of Lucia were told though out all Europe. She "appeared" in many places bringing food to hungry people. The story of her goodness and kindness to the people in her community was brought from Italy to Scandinavia by early Christian missionaries.

In Swedish lore, Lucia she appeared on a bitterly cold night to feed those who were starving because of famine. The old people said that Lucia, dressed in white with a crimson sash and crowned with light, appeared each December 13th between 3 and 4 o'clock in the morning, carrying food to people in need.

This legend is the basis of the Lucia celebration. The celebration of the Day of Saint Lucia has been a tradition at St. John's Lutheran for many years. Lucia, the Queen of Light, is accompanied by attendants, star girls, and baker boys, who will assist her in singing the traditional Lucia songs.

We welcome Lucia! May she inspire us once again to consider the influence of the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ as it is lived through the lives of the faithful, such as Lucia of old. Welcome! Welcome Lucia!


Music and Choir Robes at St. John's
